Founded in 1921, the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra is Southwest Michigan’s premiere musical organization and the state’s third largest orchestra. Serving Michigan’s sixth largest metropolitan area, the KSO provides more than 40 concert performances each year and reaches more than 31,000 adults and youth annually through exceptional symphonic music, world-class guest artists, and a vibrant educational program. Highlights from our 100th-anniversary 2021-22 season included a 6-concert outdoor summer festival and world premiere and professional recording of Andre Previn’s Concerto for Orchestra, and a centennial gala performance.

Our mission is to serve our community through outstanding musical listening and learning experiences. You will help carry out this mission in an environment where you are valued for the work you do and have an opportunity to make a difference in the community.

The Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra is a unionized orchestra with a collective bargaining agreement between the Kalamazoo Federation of Musicians, Local 228 and Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra, Inc. Under Michigan Public Act 348 of 2012, Michigan is currently a “Right to Work” state.

Position Summary

Section First Violins and Section Second Violins are members of their respective sections. Section string players are assigned specific chair numbers and have right of first refusal for all services requiring the respective positions. Section string players participate in a chair rotation process that may take place for one Masterwork concert per year. Section players may be offered work in other section chairs, or titled chairs. The KSO’s performance calendar runs September – August, with the majority of services occurring between Labor Day and Memorial Day. The 2022-23 season includes the following orchestral concert series:

Additional work including chamber music, educational ensembles, and community engagement may also be offered. Musicians are allowed cycle absences based on the number of cycles offered each season.

 - First Violin, Chair 10 - 48 services
 - First Violin, Chair 12 - 33 services
 - Second Violin, Chair 8 - 50 services
- +20% per service for doubling when applicable
- Two paid sick/personal days per season
- \$150 towards the cost of in-ear hearing protection
- Travel
 - \$0.43 per mile starting 20 miles from Kalamazoo; \$68 mileage cap per round trip
 - Homestay and hotel options available

Core Position Requirements

- Adhere to all organizational policies, including those in the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the Kalamazoo Federation of Musicians, Local 228 and the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra, Inc.
- Maintain a professional level of playing
- Ability to hear, understand and comply with both oral and written instructions
- Transportation to and from service locations
- Possible opportunities to serve in titled chairs, which may include additional duties such as providing bowings
